Art News

In art class, primary students have been learning about the elements of art and principles of design that can be used in an artwork. The first element of art that we are learning is LINE. Students are creating a drawing that combines all kinds of lines and can add outlines while using markers, oil pastels and crayons.

Intermediate students are also using lines to create an imaginary or real picture using a variety of media. Puring Friday clubs, students have been having fun using a variety of methods to create clay. Science and art are being combined to teach students to properly measure the ingredients, test for the best solutions and problem solve any problems they might come across. Simple ingredients like flour, salt, oil, kool-aid and water have been used to create elastic clay. We have also been using self drying clay, and modeling and to create miniature sculptures.

For our second art project, students will be using the second element of art, SHAPE to create a picture. For this artwork, students will be understanding that shapes can be geometric and organic and can be combined to create interesting designs. Students are allowed to use a variety of media while creating their pictures and are also able to explore multiple ways of making their ideas into a picture.

- School Social Workers are trained mental health professionals who can assist with mental health concerns, behavioral concerns, positive behavioral support, academic and classroom support, consultation with teachers, parents and administrators as well as provide individual and group counseling/therapy.
