

NOTICE TO BUILDING OCCUPANTS AND PARENTS

NOTIFICATION OF INSPECTION FOR ASBESTOS CONTAINING MATERIALS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers.

All inspections for New River Elementary School have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspection, where applicable, has been submitted to the governor for approval. A copy of this plan is located in the administrative office of this school and at the Pasco County Schools Maintenance & Facility Services Department and is available for review upon request.

Attendance

Encouraging good habits surrounding school attendance is one of the most effective ways you can prepare your child for academic success. When school attendance is a priority, you are helping your child get better grades, practice healthy life habits, avoid dangerous behavior, and have a better chance of graduating high school.

When students are absent for fewer days, their grades and reading skills often improve. Students who attend school regularly also feel more connected to their community, develop important social skills and friendships, and are significantly more likely to graduate high school.

When kids are absent for an average of just two days of school per month—excused or unexcused – it can have a negative impact. For example, elementary school students who miss an average of just two school days per month often have difficulty keeping up with their peers academically and tend to fall behind in reading. But when students are able to read on grade level by the end of third grade, they are three to four times more likely to graduate high school and attend college than their peers who struggle with reading.

As a parent, you can prepare your child for a lifetime of success by making school attendance a priority. By figuring out the reasons for your child's absences, and taking advantage of school support services—you can help set your child on a positive academic path.

We're the school counselors here at New River Elementary and we are looking forward to the new school year! Ms. Thom is looking forward to another great year, and Ms. Cooper is incredibly excited to be joining the New River family for her first year here. As your School Counselors, we are here to help ALL students be successful socially, emotionally, and behaviorally, so that they may access their education without barriers.

WHAT DO SCHOOL COUNSELORS DO?:

- Classroom Lessons We visit all grades to teach social-emotional skills such as feelings, communication, problem-solving, diversity, respect, etc. Our Safer Smarter Kids curriculum provides important lessons to students to help them become respectful and responsible citizens.
- Small Group Counseling We facilitate small groups for students who need a little extra support in a certain area (ex: social skills, coping, emotional regulation, etc.)
- Individual Counseling We meet with students short-term to work through problems affecting their educational and personal success.
- Consultation with Staff/Parents We are available to meet/talk with teachers and parents so that we may help support students and provide resources and education about issues affecting children.

WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT YOUR COUNSELORS...

- We are ONE part of our support team that works to help children succeed. We work hard to get to know ALL students so they may feel connected and safe while with us in school.
- · Please feel free to reach out to use with any questions of concerns that might arise throughout the school year!

Traffic Safety On Our Campus

This year with the increase in students, that also brings an increase in cars and an increase in wait time. Our goal every morning and afternoon is to get all students dropped off and picked up safely. For this reason, we want to be sure that all families cooperate with the following reminders:

- The speed limit on school property is 15 mph at all times.
- Students may only get out of or into cars at the numbered spaces in front of the school (unless escorted to or from the parking lot by an adult). No drop offs in the parking lot.
- It is important to decide how your child is going home prior to coming to school (except in the case if an emergency).
 Discuss that with your child and be sure the teacher is informed. Changing frequently is confusing to your child and the staff. The choices are: CAR RIDER, WALK UP/ PICK UP, BUS RIDER, WALKER/BIKE RIDER, PLACE.
- Please be sure to follow the arrows in the parking lanes of the parking lot.
- Remember our entry road is only two lanes, one entering and one leaving. It is a solid line, no pass zone.
