

## News from the Clinic: Hand Washing Reminder!

The cold and flu season is approaching and frequent hand washing is considered the single most effective way to cut down on the spread of infectious diseases. <u>Proper and consistent</u> hand washing greatly reduces the risk of spreading germs. When washing hands, follow these simple steps:

- \* Wet hands with warm running water.
- \* Add soap, lather hands, between fingers, backs of hands, and under fingernails for about 20 seconds.
- \* Rinse hands.
- \* Dry with clean paper towel.
- \* Turn off water with paper towel, not your clean hands. Throw towel away.
