
Principal's Message


Pasco Schools to Hold Information Meetings on New State Standards

Pasco County Public Schools has scheduled a series of 13 community meetings starting at Anclote High School on January 14, 2014, to educate parents and the community about Florida's new standards for K-12 students.

Meetings are scheduled from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at each district high school for parents whose children attend the high schools and the elementary and middle schools that feed into them. Those who attend will hear a presentation by district experts, receive materials explaining what the Common Core State Standards are and are not, and participate in a question and answer period.

The Florida Board of Education adopted the standards in 2010, and in 2011 schools began implementing curriculum and training teachers to help kindergarten and first grade students master the standards. The standards will be fully implemented in all grades starting with the 2014-2015 school year.

The meeting schedule is attached. It also can be viewed by going onto the Pasco Schools homepage, <u>www.pascoschools.org</u>, and clicking on the CCSS link under Quick Links. The Common Core page includes news links and multiple sources of information for students, parents, and the community.

When a parent spends time one-on-one, side by side, listening to a child read, it brings a whole new level of interest, thinking, and engagement to the experience.

By taking an active role in teaching your child to read, you are setting an example of the value you place on reading. As your child progresses through each level of the program, you will experience your own "Aha!" moments together. You will be in tune with the specific needs of your child and this will make you the most effective reading coach your child could ever have.

American Reading at Home uses actual books to teach reading. While this may sound like a no-brainer to many parents, our method stands in contrast to many other approaches that instead rely on repetitive workbook exercises and/or interactive activities/games. Using real books creates a context for learning that nurtures the young inquisitive mind. It also builds confidence in reading books right from the start, before a child can even read words.

Slow Cooker Upside Down Chicken Pot Pie

INGREDIENTS

- 1 ¼ pounds boneless skinless chicken thighs
- 1 tablespoon instant chopped onion
- 1 dried bay leaf

2/3 cup milk 1 jar (18 oz) chicken gravy

- 1 jar (1 2 medium celery stalks, cut into 1/2-inch slices
- 2 ¼ cups Original Bisquick® mix

1 bag (12 oz) Green Giant® Valley Fresh Steamers' frozen mixed vegetables

1 Place chicken in 3 ½ - to 4-quart slow cooker. Top with onion, bay leaf, pepper and gravy. Place celery on gravy.

- 3 About 30 minutes before serving, make and bake 8 biscuits using Bisquick mix and milk as directed on package.
- 4 Meanwhile, gently stir frozen vegetables into chicken mixture. Increase heat setting to High. Cover and cook 15 minutes. Remove bay leaf.
- 5 For each serving, split biscuit and place in soup bowl or tart pan. Spoon about ³/₄ cup chicken mixture on top of biscuit.
- 6 Enjoy and don't forget to send in your box tops to New River!
