


Principal's Message

2014 FCAT Writes Information



Our 4th grade students will be taking the Grade 4 FCAT 2.0 Writing Test on Tuesday, February 25, 2014. The only day for make-up testing is February 26, 2014.

The FCAT 2.0 Writing Test is administered in one 60-minute session in which students write an essay in response to a prompt. Later this spring, your student will receive a score for his/her writing on a scale from 1-6 score points. There is no "passing" score for FCAT 2.0 Writing. However, the percentage of students scoring 4 or above in the spring 2014 administration will be used for the Writing proficiency component of school grade calculations. You may visit http://fcat.fldoe.org/writing-prompts.asp to access writing prompt descriptions and scoring quides with sample essays.

 Mini Conversation-Heart Cookies

 1 pouch Betty Crocker® sugar cookie mix

 1/3 cup butter, softened
 1 egg

- 3 tablespoons Gold Medal® all-purpose flour
- 2 containers Betty Crocker® Rich & Creamy vanilla frosting
- Pink, purple, yellow, green and orange food colors
- 1 Heat oven to 375°F. In medium bowl, stir cookie mix, butter, flour and egg until soft dough forms.
- 2 Roll dough 1/4 inch thick on floured surface. Cut out approximately 100 cookies with 1-inch heart-shaped cookie cutter, re-rolling dough as necessary. Place 1 inch apart on ungreased cookie sheet.
- 3 Bake 6 to 8 minutes or until edges are set. Cool on cookie sheet 1 minute. Remove to cooling racks. Cool completely, about 15 minutes.
- 4 Meanwhile, divide frosting among 6 small bowls, about 1/3 cup each.
 Using food colors, tint frosting in each bowl a different color, leaving 1 bowl white.
- 5 Working with 1 color at a time, microwavable small bowl of frosting uncovered on High 8 to 10 seconds or until thin enough to pour.
- 6 Using 2 forks, dip and roll each cookie in melted frosting to cover completely, letting excess drip off. Place on cooling rack placed over waxed paper to catch drips. Repeat with remaining cookies and colored frosting. Let stand at least 3 hours at room temperature until frosting is set.
