Students are beginning to learn about sculpture and the art element of form. Students will be able to compare and contrast 2-D and 3-D shapes and solids by looking at pictures, and by thinking about real life objects. Students are also practicing how to make solids such as pyramids, spheres, cubes, rectangular prisms and cylinders while using modeling clay.

Students will demonstrate what they have learned by creating a 3-D earth clay sculpture. They will practice how to roll, score, attach and add details to their piece. Also, students will understand how the process of firing and drying makes their sculptures ready to be painted and glazed. At the end of this fun unit, all students will be able to take their sculptures home.
