## Art News

During the last quarter for this school year, art students will be reviewing about all the concepts learned, such as the elements of art and principal of design. Primary students are also working with oil pastels using strokes of color to learn how Vincent van Gogh created his famous picture: "Starry Night". Our intermediate students are working on a landscape using the strokes of color and learning about a sense of real space in their pictures.

Primary students will also be able to use self drying clay to create a sculpture and learn how 3-D is different than 2-D shapes. When the sculptures dry, the students will be painting their creations while using tempera paints.

Our intermediate students will be using watercolor paints to create an imaginary picture while learning about the famous artist, Pablo Picasso. Finally, we hope all students who are participating in the Art Show will be coming on May 17th from 5-7 in the media center. Also, expect to see lots of sculptures done by intermediate students during the art show. It is exciting to see how our students are so creative in art class.

2. Read something every day.

- Evening: End the day by reading their current book.

3. Keep Reading Aloud- Have your child read aloud to you and you to them. This helps to model appropriate fluency and rate.
