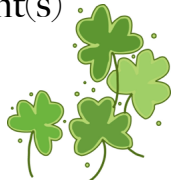
Our school-wide expectations are to Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be Safe. These expectations are clearly defined for all areas of the school. At the beginning of the year and after breaks, students are taught what the expected behaviors for each area. We reward student for following the expectations after each subject. Students are able to earn a total of \$7 daily, with bonuses for exceeding expectations. With the money student’s earn, they are able to shop at the school mall that occurs at the end of each quarter.

Counselors' Corner



It's just about that time of year again... State Assessment time! When it comes to test-taking, your students may have some fears or anxiety about test-taking. Here are a few ways to ensure that your child is prepared and ready-to-go when our testing season rolls around.

Tips to give your child about taking tests:

- Relax. Just do the best you can.
- Your first choice is usually correct. Don't change an answer unless you have a good reason to do so.
- Be aware of key words such as "all," "now," "always," "never," "only," "exactly."
- In multiple-choice questions, don't skip the longest answer. It should be considered, since test writers want to be sure the correct answer is accurate—they may add lots of details to insure accuracy!
- Look for information in some of the questions. This information may help you answer other questions.

You can assist your child prepare for testing by doing the following:

- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep before a test, and eats properly on test day.
- Try to make the morning of the test a pleasant one so there's less stress.
- Make sure your child has taken any needed medication.
- Get your child to school on time the day of the test.
- Wish your child good luck each morning on his/her test days!
- Remind your child the test is important. Encourage them to do his/her best.
- Help your child to review the material before testing.
- Remind your child to listen carefully to the instructions and to read the directions and each question carefully.
- Explain to your child the importance of using time wisely and using his/her best guess to move on.
- Tell your child to attempt to answer all of the questions; Don't leave any blank!
- Encourage your child to stay focused, even if other students finish early.
- If your child is disappointed after taking a test, reassure him or her that there will be plenty of opportunities to improve and succeed.

Sunshine State Books

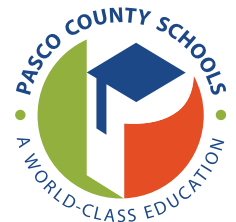

The purpose of the SSYRA Program is to encourage students to read independently for pleasure and to read books that are on, above, and below their reading level in order to improve their reading fluency. Sunshine State books are selected for their wide appeal, literary value, varied genres, curriculum connections, and/or multicultural representation.
