#### Early Release Days are Coming Next Year

Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, Pasco County Schools is implementing a monthly, two-hour early release schedule. Early release days allow for staff to engage in professional development aligned to student needs and district and school priorities. Early release days will be once a month, on a Wednesday, as follows: September 11, October 9, November 13, December 11, January 15, February 12, March 11, April 8

Parents with childcare concerns have options provided by our PLACE program, and we will be working with private daycare facilities to develop a list of other choices. Students already enrolled in PLACE programs will be able to stay the extra two hours without additional charges. Current morning-only PLACE students may attend in the afternoon without charge. A package option for all eight early release days is available for students not currently enrolled in PLACE. Students registered with this package option will not be required to pay a registration fee. Parents who have a last-minute need for their children to attend PLACE also may register at any time prior to the early release day that care is needed. The daily drop-in fee and registration fee will apply. ## Kindergarten Registration

Monday, May 13, 2019 9:45am - 12:00 noon or 5:30pm - 6:30pm Media Center at New River Elem.

Please be sure to bring Original Birth Certificate, Social Security card, Record of Immunization (shot record), Physical Form (dated within 1 year of starting school), and 3 Proofs of Residency (deed/property tax or lease agreement; utility bill; and either an auto registration, FL drivers license, FL ID card, or voter registration card). Remember your child must be 5 on or before September 1, 2019.

#### School Lockdown Procedures

- Controlled Campus- A POTENTIAL threat or safety concern exists that requires a greater degree of control.
- **Lockdown** A direct threat to the school campus, staff, or student body.
- Parent WILL NOT be allowed on campus and will be provided instructions as to a reunification location and time, if necessary. This is to ensure the safety of the students and so a parent is not misidentified as a potential threat to the school.
- Pasco Sheriff's Office and school personal actively train for such occurrences and work as one cohesive unit to ensure campus safety. Allowing and interruption or unauthorized visitors during these occurrences will only cause confusion and delay the assessment of the potential threat and could jeopardize all students' safety.
- Parents will not be allowed on campus to pick up children for even regular scheduled doctor's appointments until a lockdown is over. Interference or disruption during these occurrences from ANYONE coming on campus could subject them to arrest, as your child's safety if our first priority.
- Official information during these occurrences will be disseminated using our Pasco Sheriff's School Safety social media sites. This information will be vetted from the affected school through collaboration of Sheriff's and school personnel. Other unofficial sources often confuse or add misinformation to situations that have not been confirmed. This includes your child calling you and not having factual information.
- The affected school during the occurrence will receive more phone calls than personnel will be able to answer. Do not call the school during this time as emergency responders will also be calling to acquire information about the alleged incident and additional phone calls to the school could back the phone lines.
- The Pasco Sheriff's Office and school personnel always do their best to ensure every child's safety on campus, and we ask all parents and guardians to have patience and trust during these situations.
